Why is Mobile Equipment a Critical Risk?

Although construction is complete, there is still important clean-up and reclamation work to be done along the right-of-way. Our work will continue to utilize mobile equipment such as excavators, bulldozers, trucks and large transport vehicles as we clean up the right-of-way and get ready for operations.

You can get seriously injured, or worse, if equipment moves unexpectedly, or if they get caught in pinch points or blind spots.

Keeping safe around mobile equipment

Trying to dodge mobile equipment on a construction site is like playing real-life 'Frogger' - but with bigger consequences and no extra lives! When working with mobile equipment, stay alert and protect yourself and others by keeping these tips front of mind:



- Scan your working area before the shift starts and make a plan based on your surroundings
- Report any potential risks, issues or concerns to your team immediately – it is better to start late than unsafe
- Make sure all maintenance tasks are conducted
