Avoid a STCKY situation during clean-up and reclamation

Completing construction on Coastal GasLink was a monumental feat, but the work does not stop there.

With all of the pipe in the ground, clean-up and reclamation work is ramping up – and so is the risk of critical safety incidents.

Hazards don't sleep just because construction is complete, and we must continue to hold safety as our number one priority.

We can significantly reduce the risk of a critical incident by better understanding the **Stuff That Can Kill You** (STCKY).

By driving a greater understanding of STCKY, we can work to eliminate the most dangerous activities and behaviours that can lead to critical incidents, including death.

Integrating STCKY into your everyday

To ensure STCKY is top of mind, there are three questions that should always be part of the conversation before you start any work:

- 1. What's STCKY today?
- 2. What are we doing about the STCKY situations and how are we protecting each other?
- 3. Is there more that we should be doing?

STCKY and the Critical Risks

Safety is a focused effort, and although there are hundreds of hazards that exist in the work we do, we are narrowing in on the following **Critical Risks:**



Driving

Driving accidents can happen at any time, especially when driving in bad weather, at night, or at the end of a shift when you are tired.



Steep slope work

Equipment sliding or materials and debris rolling down steep slopes are a risk to anyone in the line of fire.



Mobile equipment and people

Workers can get seriously injured or killed if equipment moves unexpectedly, or they get caught in pinch points or blind spots.



Work over live lines

Unintended contact with live lines can have significant consequences and pose serious risk to workers and the public.



Cargo management

Items may fall or be dropped while loading or unloading cargo, which could injure anyone nearby. Loads can shift and become unstable during transport, causing materials to fall off the trailer when straps are removed.



STCKY is foundational to our daily safety conversations and as we navigate clean-up and reclamation we will elevate the **Critical Risks** and highlight them to drive awareness and attention.
